This year, we are offering a summer camp experience to our elementary children. Each week will have a different theme with activities based around it as laid out below. There will be one teacher who will be present throughout the whole summer, but each week, a new expert teacher will join to teach us about new areas of expertise. While this is not a Montessori program, we will hold to the principals of a Montessori education, such as supporting students to be independent and treating each other and our environment kindly.

ENROLLMENT SPECIFICS

- An **enrollment deposit of \$50** is due with this registration form. This payment is non-refundable but is applied to the first summer session payment.
- You will be financially responsible for what you select on this sheet. Summer tuition is non-refundable after June 10th.
- In the event that no space is available to accommodate your registration, your deposit will be returned to you.
- If enrollment is under eight students for a week, the special activity for the week will be canceled. You will have ten days from the announcement that camp is under enrolled to decide whether to withdraw. If you choose not to withdraw, you will be charged the "regular camp week" activity rate and your child will get to spend the week enjoying a variety of summer activities around the school.

- Bake and create! Does your child love to bake delicious treats and make their very own art masterpieces? Join Ms. Maria for a week of Art and Baking.

- June 19th – 23rd - Fiber Arts Camp with Ms. Shannon**

- During Fiber Arts camps, the students will work with fabrics and yarns in different ways. The week's projects will include: dying fabric multiple ways (natural plants, Shibori, Sharpies, and Glue Batik) and then using the altered fabric to make a bag to take home; learning the knit and purl stitches and making a scarf, bracelet, or belt; weaving a wall hanging from fabric and yarn.
